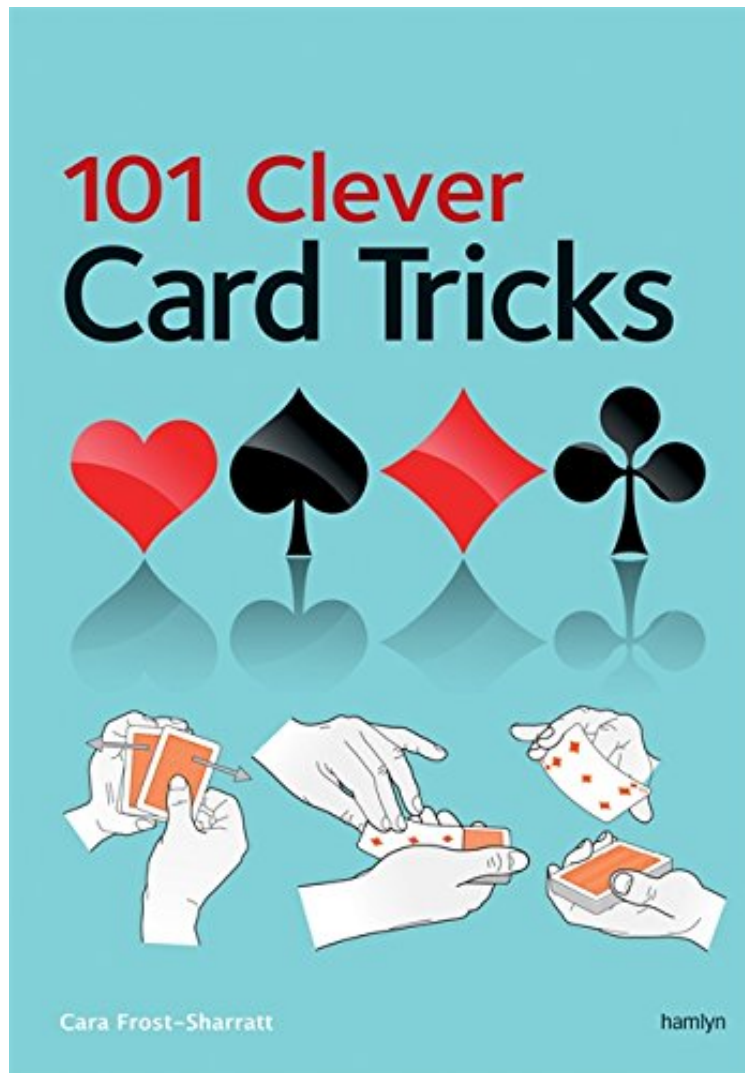

For what it's supposed to be - a book for beginners - it's a great bang for the buck and a great way to dip your foot in the pool of card magic. You won't fool Penn and Teller with anything in the book, but you'll fool most everyone you know. A particularly nice feature of the book is that the tricks come with performance tips, stuff to do and stuff to avoid when you're showing a trick. The previous review says that a lot of descriptions are confusing, but I didn't see a single one that was. And as for the previous reviewer's "Some of the tricks take too long to set up the deck and if someone shuffles it the trick is done for. I prefer more sleight of hand card tricks," I would contend that anyone with sufficient skill in sleight of hand already knows a lot of these tricks anyway (and therefore shouldn't be confused by the clear descriptions within!). If you buy this book, like it and wish to progress further, make your next stop "Royal Road to Card Magic."

This simple step-by-step guide makes magic easy no matter what your age. Use 'Brain power' tricks that use mathematics and exercise your memory skills to perform mind-reading stunts. Inventive tricks using mobile phones will delight more experienced magicians looking for something new.
