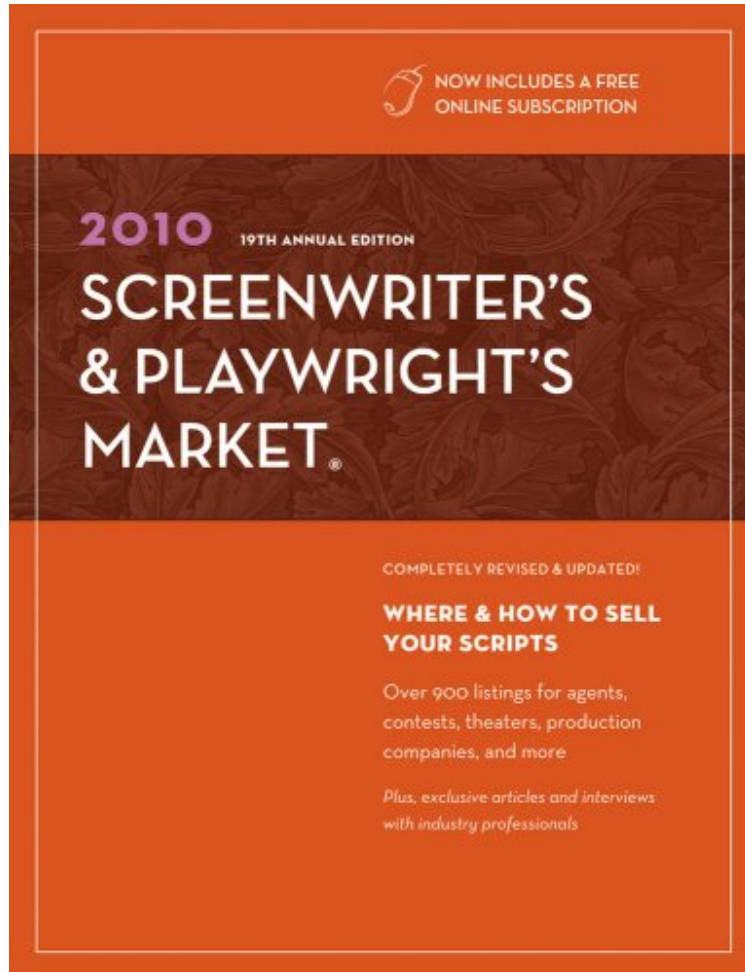

Many of the contests have the same information from the 2009 book with no new updates for the current year. As to the Manager and Agency listings, while the book certainly provides a number of them - the information often seems

inadequate and spotty. Why does the book say it is acceptable to send queries to one place, only to find that on the agency's website they explicitly state no queries, no submissions, no exceptions? There seems to be a lack of research, follow-up, or whatever it may be, that would provide the writer with all the information they need.
