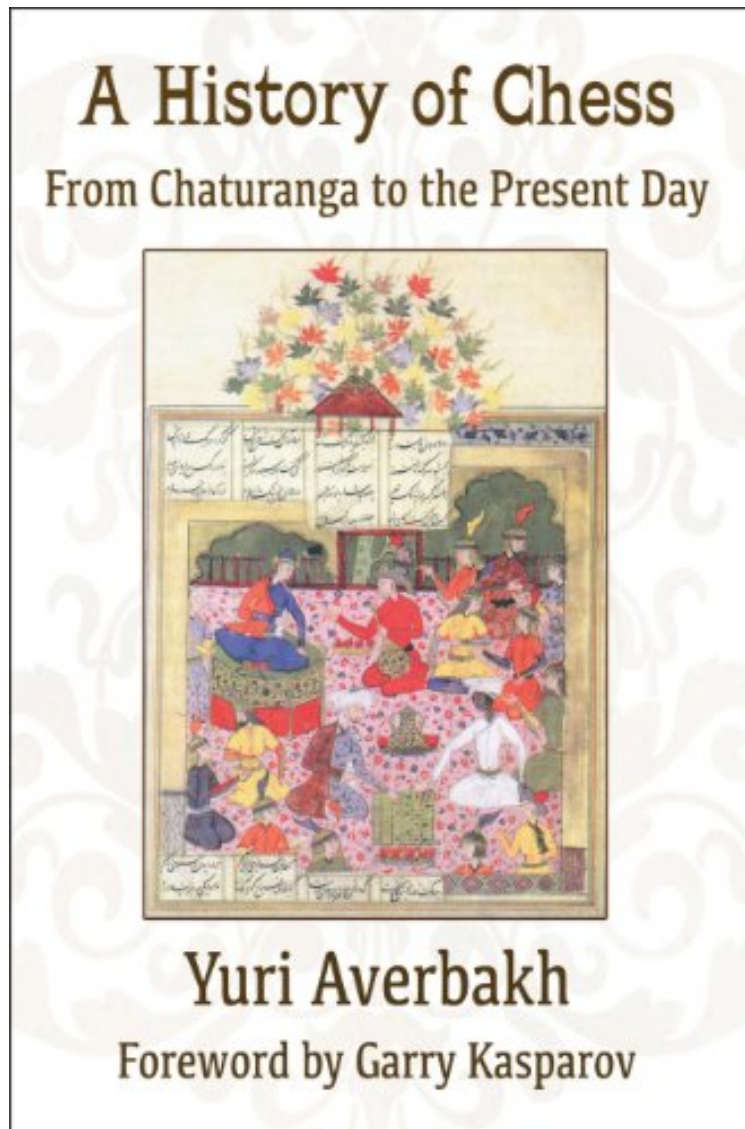

Chess: An Historical Perspective Chess the Royal Game is an ancient board game, perhaps fifteen hundred years old. There are many legends about how chess came to be. Most of them are folk tales and are far from reality.
