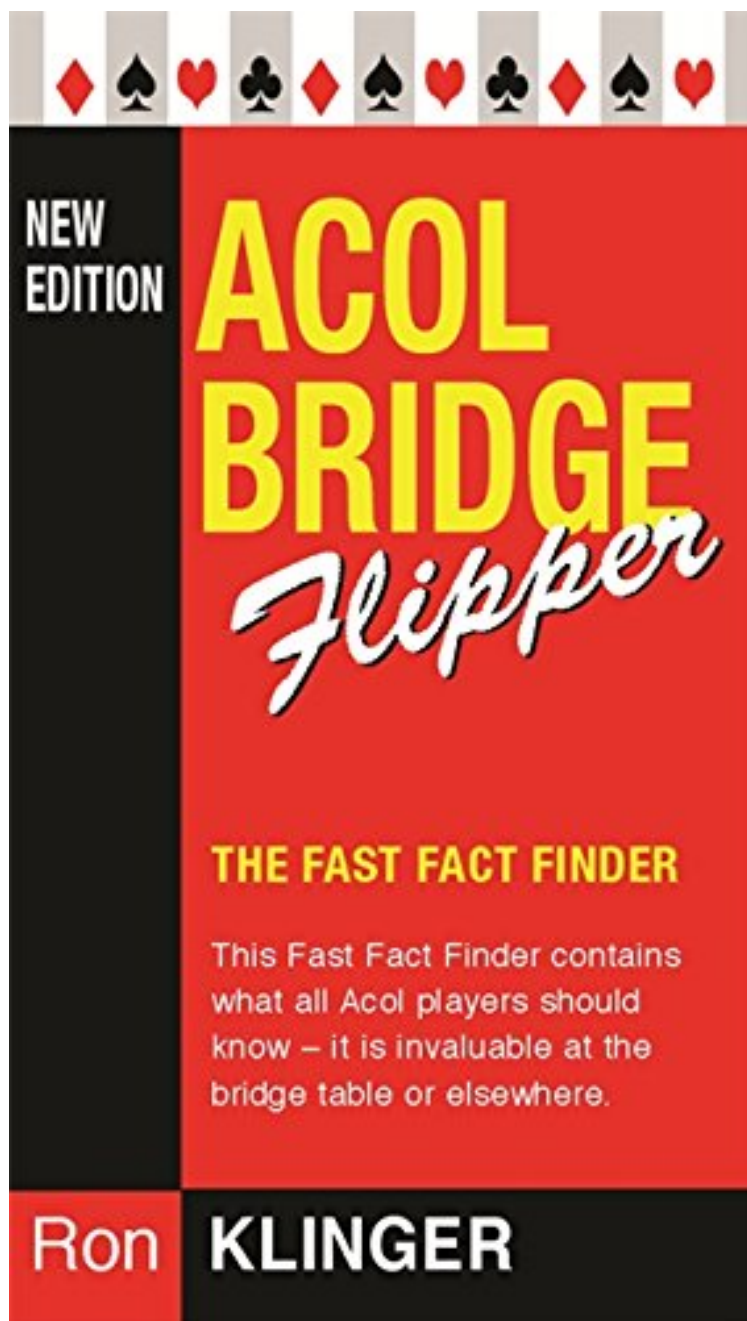

British contract bridge bidding system By ealovitt ACOL is the bridge bidding system that, according to "The Official Encyclopedia of Bridge," is "standard in British tournament play." I have never seen it used in the USA, but my tournament experience is limited to Michigan. It is named after the Acol Bridge Club, previously located on Acol Road in London, where the system started to evolve in the late 1920s. This ACOL Bridge Flipper is a handy, pocket-sized set of charts that will help beginning contract bridge players bid their hands the 'ACOL' way. There are 14 graduated charts within the guide: 1. Opening the Bidding 2. Two-Openings 3. Responding to NT Openings 4. Replying to a Suit Opening 5. Opener's Rebids 6. Responder's Rebids 7. Reverses and Jump-Shifts 8. Pre-Emptive Bidding 9. Overcalls Jump-Overcalls 10. Takeout Doubles 11. Slam Methods 12. Opening Leads 13. Signalling 14.
