While I don't use it a lot, it's a very historically important deck from the late 60's and the hippie tarot resurgence. I believe mine is a reprint or a bootleg reproduction of the first edition deck, which didn't come with instructions. My box says copyright 1968 Tarot Productions Inc. The box and the cards were crisp and shiny new and the cards had nubs on the edges where they were perforated together. The colors are indeed psychedelic, but a rich dark array of colors, no pastels here, mine are a bit muddy where there's a lot of grey or black detail, but the separation is good elsewhere and all my grapes are purple, I just checked. Mine are dot matrix printed I think, not scanned/printed. These would be THE deck to get if you were a one deck kind of person, but mine are part of a collection and don't get used as often. UPDATE... I have bought an Albano Tarot that is the US Games edition, this one printed in Italy, with a hard slick glossy finish, and that distinct varnish scent of other printed in Italy US Games decks. It does indeed look like a scan of a scan of a scan, but the colors are very saturated and the lines only slightly blurry, giving it a magic marker effect. I kinda really like it though, maybe more than my reproduction deck I got first. Still gets 5 stars for the colors and everything. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful.
