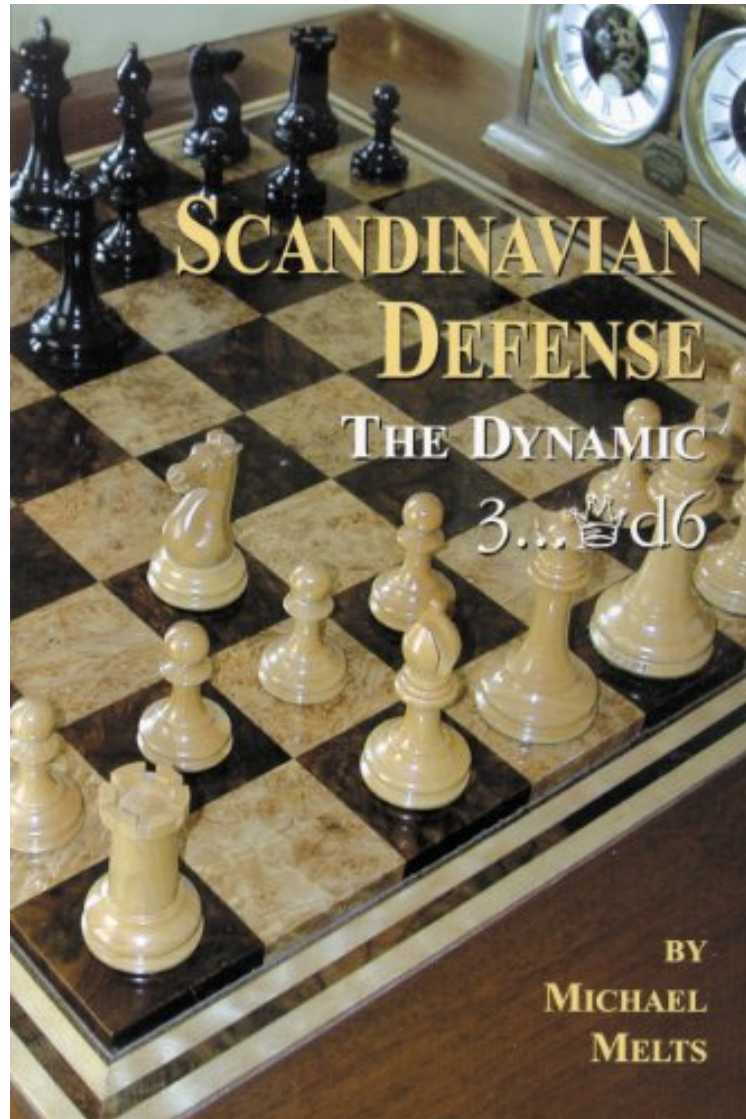

5 of 5 people found the following review helpful. IMPORTANT OMISSION By Nimzo-Karpov This isn't a bad book. The Scandinavian Melts variation is becoming increasingly popular. GM are playing it (albeit, mostly in speed tournaments). My problem with the book (2nd Ed) is that Melts leaves out one of the strongest White responses. If you play the c6 variation and White plays g3 and Bishop to g2 variation, you won't find this killer variation in the book. He does consider this variation if Black plays a6. This is a big omission, since the g3 pawn provides an anchor for White's

dark square Bishop on f4 and gives Black some headaches. As one of the reviewer's said, this books seems to be written for the correspondence player because of the thicket variations given. It's a good book, since there is a paucity of books on this variation, but, it could have been better.8 of 8 people found the following review helpful. Well written and insightfulBy James BunchA very good book, good expansion on his previous book on the same variation. It gave me the tools I needed to put it into practice immediately. Pretty thorough, although he doesn't cover every variation completely. One variation that he only covers topically is 4.g3 followed by an early Bg2 and Nge2. I ran into this idea in a recent tournament and while I held my own into the middle-game, White would have eventually crashed through on the Queenside. I think this is a good response for White, and it needs more attention. (I followed his suggestion with 4.g3 a6, but I think c6 might be better.) An excellent book for any Scandinavian Qd6 specialist.By brianI have been playing Qd6 for two years and this book is very useful.It is a good book for experienced Qd6 players and stronger club players.Inexperienced weaker players may need an introductory book first.One minor criticism is that there is not much detail on lines which avoid the Scandinavian Qd6 line:1 e4 d5 2 e5, 1 e4 d5 2 Nc3, 1 e4 d5 2 d4 (Blackmar gambit).Not played often -but you don't want to get a nasty surprise - worth a bit of study.
