Difficulty-wise, I would say these are slightly easier than the Cox/Rathvon Mensa books. And which I also highly recommend. Although, because Hooke is not as into anagrams as Cox/Rathvon, it actually made his book harder for me in spots. But for relatively ambitious cryptic newbies, who don't mind getting their butts kicked once in a while, you can't go wrong with Hook or Cox/Rathvon. (I have been bashing away at cryptics for about 7-8, months now, after a lifelong relationship with the NYT crossword. But now I am a cryptic addict. Be warned - these can get very addictive.) I am working my way up to the Cox/Rathvon Atlantic Cryptics book, which contains variety cryptics, which add an extra difficulty level to regular cryptics.
