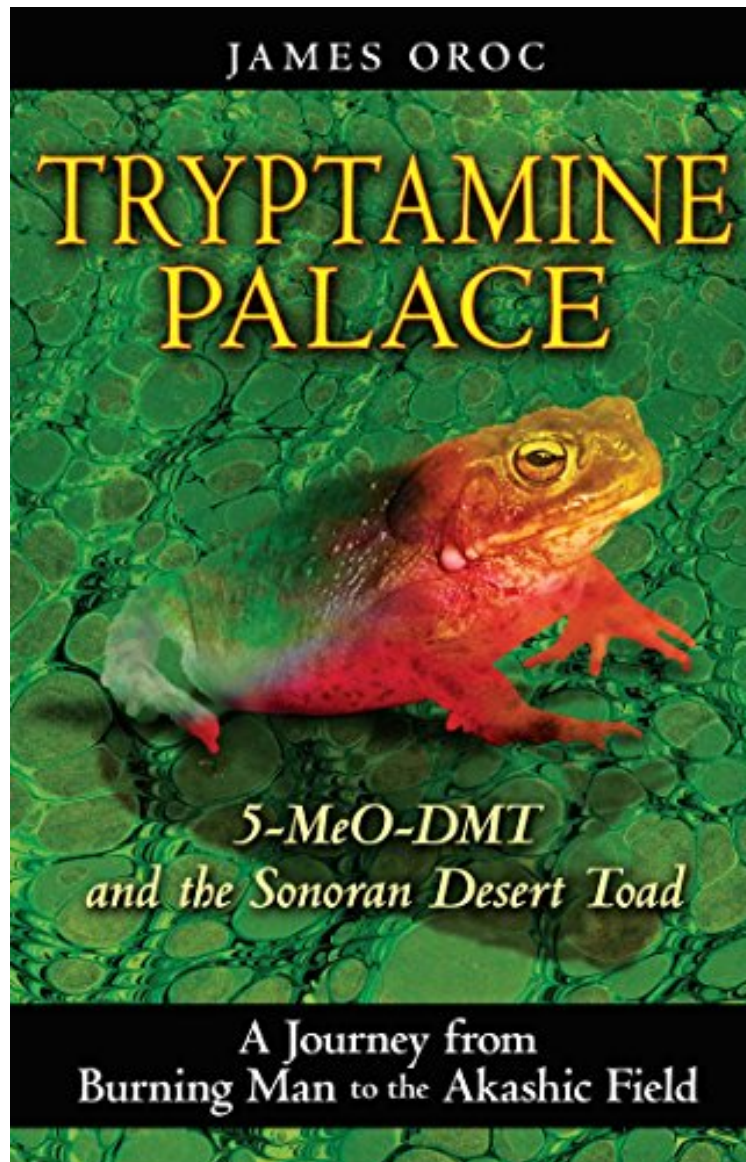

James Oroc goes very deeply into metaphysics and interpretations of quantum physics in trying to make sense of his 5-meo-dmt experiences.
