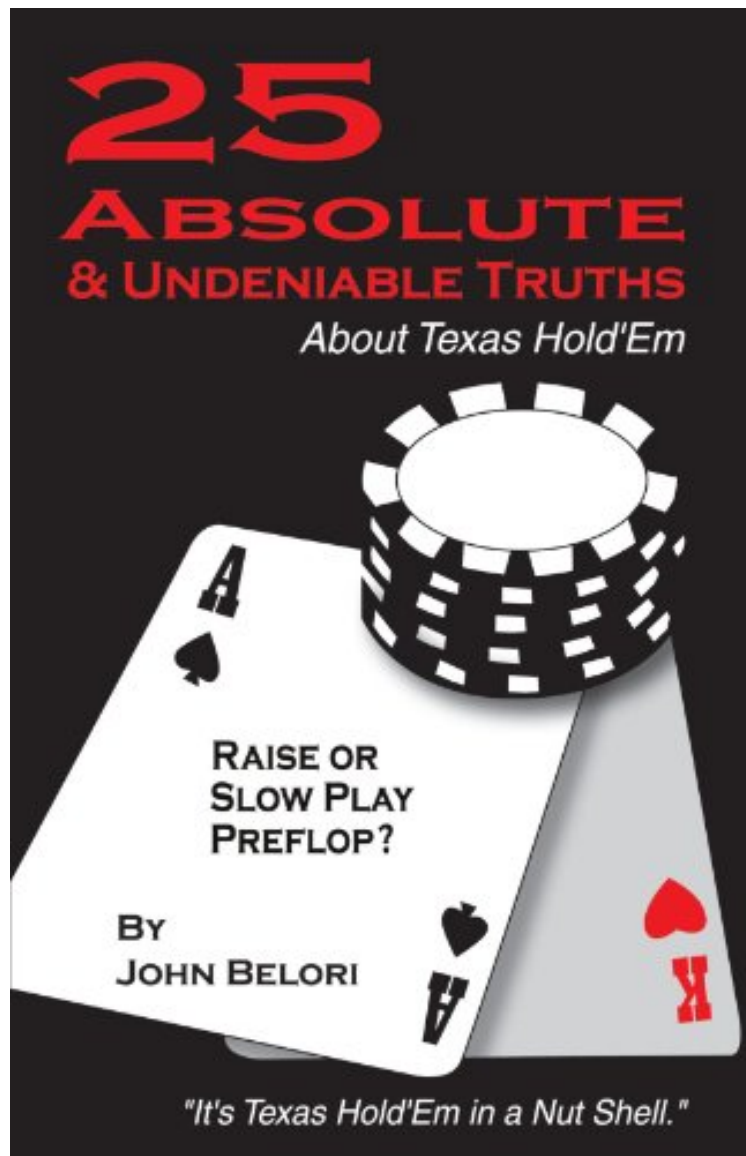

Trust me when I tell you, this is the absolute worst, and the most dangerous book on holdem that you can possibly get your hands on! I respect the author for being an old man who fought in WWII. No disrespect to him personally. But if you want to never really learn much about Holdem, and do not ever care about moving up in stakes, and have just enough time to read exactly 39 pages and no more, and do not ever care if you win or lose, ...then you still should NOT read this book! As an example of the horrible advice: The author tells you to shut down your mind and pay no attention to the action and the play of other players when you are not in the hand!!! LOL!!! Oh my god! You can then build on that knowledge by reading books on tournament play, the latest good one being "The Raiser's Edge" or Miller's Small Stakes No Limit Holdem for no limit cash games. What this book has is nothing but a summary of other author's advice that the author admits to copying, (while also admitting that he is only a breakeven player), with wrong and terrible advice peppered in between which is sure to make you go broke fast and ensure that you will never ever move up in stakes. What a waste of eleven bucks. I threw my copy in the garbage can. I do not want it sitting in the shelf with all the great poker books that I own.
