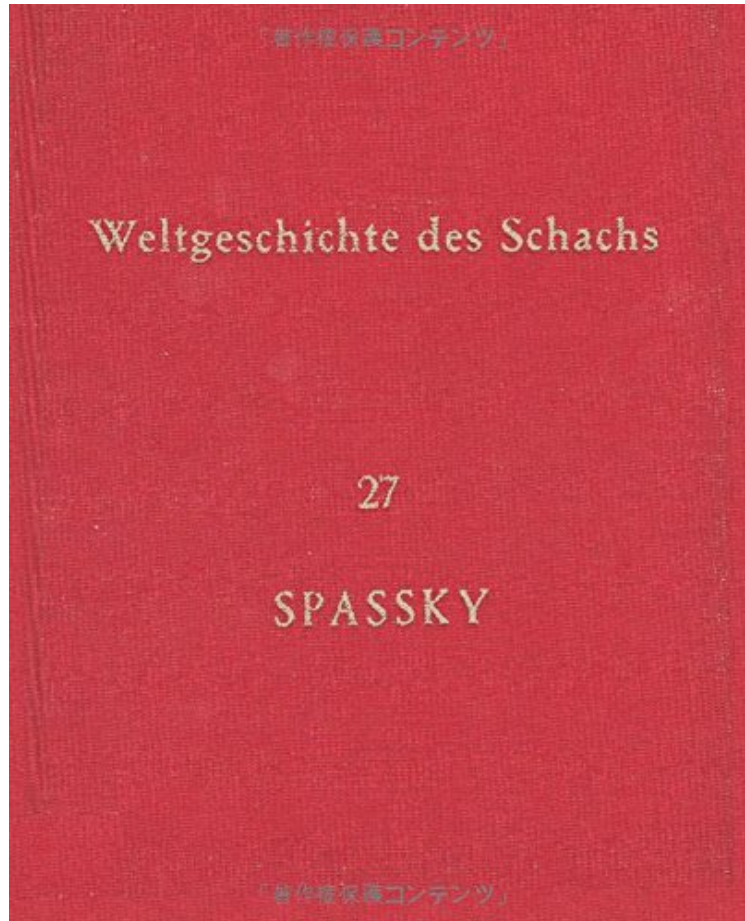

There's a diagram after every 5 moves, making it reasonable to follow along without a board for club players and above. In this case, Bobby Fischer used it to prepare for his 1972 match with Spassky.

This is the book Bobby Fischer studied in preparing to play his epic match for the World Chess Championship against Boris Spassky. In order to complete the record of these games, the scores of the Fischer-Spassky Match are included in an appendix in the back of this book. The New York Times reported: "FERNDALE, N.Y. when he is seen, he is carrying or reading what is jokingly called the big red book to distinguish it from Quotations From Chairman Mao, which is the little red book. Bound in red velvet, the big book contains the chess games of Boris Spassky, the Russian, who is the world chess champion, and for Bobby Fischer it is every bit as important as the sparring partners boxing champions drag up to this 1,000-acre resort when they are in training." . . . "Training for the 6-foot 2-inch, 29-year old challenger consists of studying the Spassky Red Book, which he takes with him to the Grossinger dining room. He normally eats alone at a table while studying the book or playing with a chess set. "Several times a week, at about 11 PM, he takes the red book and walks into the town to eat at the Triangle Lodge, a bar and grill. There he usually orders Chinese or Italian food and a glass of milk or a glass of beer. The waitresses dislike him because, they say, he takes up two tables while eating."

About the Author In the 1950s, Dr. Edward Wildhagen announced an ambitious project entitled Weltgeschichte des Schachs which means World History of Chess. His plan was to include every game ever played at the World Championship level, with a diagram every five moves so that many players could play over the games in their heads without setting up the board and pieces. There were 16 volumes actually published in this series. This appears to have been one of the last. It appears that Wildhagen did not complete his project, as there was no volume covering the games Alekhine or Smyslov, although all the other World Champions were covered.
