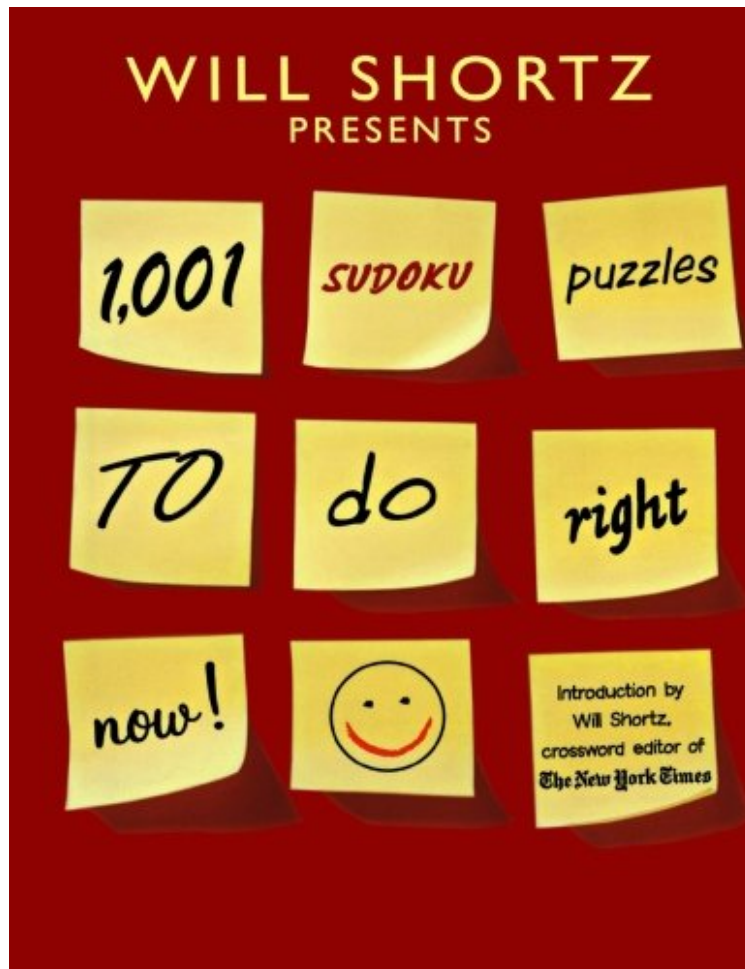

His books, along with the Mensa ones, are our favorites. This however, is not nearly as good as most of Shortz' other books.I bought it because of the large number of puzzles for the money (I bought a "used" copy). But there are

several problems: The large size of the book makes it unwieldy for working in your lap -- or even on a table. We resorted to tearing pages out to work on puzzles. The lack of a spiral binding only adds to the above problem. It won't lay flat, and the huge size means that you're always working on a curved page. Many of the puzzles seem to be mis-categorized. For example, the "Light Easy" are generally more difficult than the "Demanding" ones. And in general, the puzzles are easier than the ones in Shortz' other books. Finally, if you're new to sudoku puzzles, the instructions are pretty brief and don't really give tips on solving anything beyond the easiest puzzles. Better sudoku books include: *Sudoku For Dummies*-- good for beginners, explains solving techniques in detail although it does not cover the most advanced solving techniques. *Will Shortz Presents The Little Luxe Book of Sudoku: 335 Easy to Hard Puzzles* -- a good book for the average solver, but does not have any information on solving techniques. *Absolutely Nasty Sudoku Level 2 (Mensa)* -- this is about equal to Shortz' "Very Challenging" puzzles and the level 3 and 4 books are even tougher. Yes, these all cost a little more on a "per-puzzle" basis, but they are worth it. I'm still giving this one 3 stars because we have not found any puzzles with errors, the problems are just with the format and puzzle classification.

If you can't get enough of these addictive, seductive puzzles, then the book for you has finally arrived. So prepare to dive into sudoku: With one thousand and one puzzles, you'll always be satisfied! And with it's fun, portable square trim, you'll be able to solve sudoku wherever you go.
